ABOUT THE ORGANIZER

Apart from the current national conference organized by CASIHR, the Centre has recently organized a One-day Training Program on Human Rights and a National Seminar on Human Rights is scheduled to be organized on 7th February 2015. The CASIHR also publishes its monthly newsletter “The Human Rights Communiqué” which covers wide array of national and international issues of human rights and intends to bring forth the latest developments in the human rights jurisprudence, globally.

CONCEPT NOTE:

Human Rights, especially after the Universal Declaration of Human Rights have come to occupy a pivotal place in international and national policy considerations. Human Rights enumerated in UDHR have been enshrined in the Constitution of India with zeal. Apart from codification in the Indian Constitution, National Human Rights Commission, State Commissions, Non-governmental organizations and the judiciary have made various efforts to promote and protect human rights.

However, the increased focus on human rights has not yielded satisfactory results. The reality of the day is “Too much emphasis – Too many violations”. This whole situation trickles down to the fact that despite stringent enforcement of laws, efforts by the government and the judiciary, the active role of media and the human rights agencies, the human rights

scenario world over is posed with various challenges and for a larger section of the society, human rights are still an abstract concept.

In this backdrop, the importance of Human Rights Education acquires increased importance; it assumes potential significance in transforming human rights issues into reality. This Conference is thus an endeavor to spread awareness regarding the multi faceted concept of human rights amongst the youth, academia and even the common masses.

CALL FOR PAPERS

Conference papers are invited from the academicians, practitioners, researchers, scholars and students on the issues related to the themes. It is also proposed that the selected papers will be published in the form of an edited book carrying an ISBN No. Only full papers submitted on or before the deadline shall be considered for publication.

The authors of selected abstracts will be given an opportunity to present their papers during various sessions on the days of the conference.

GUIDELINES FOR CONFERENCE PAPER

The abstract should contain not more than 300–350 words along with the particulars of the author indicating his email id, contact number and address for correspondence. A paper cannot have more than two co-authors.

The maximum limit of a paper is 4000 words (excluding footnotes). The format is Times New Roman, Font Size 12, 1.5 line spacing, on an A4 sheet with 1” margin on all sides, to be sent in .doc/.docx format.
