Scope

The Indian Competition Law Review (“ICLR”) is an annual journal, published in month of February each year. ICLR strives to provide a platform for discussion of international as well as national developments in the field of competition law. ICLR regularly publishes contributions from experienced practitioners whilst giving due importance to the work of early career academicians and law students at the same time. Each issue contains:

- i. Articles, which analyze topics of permanent interest from major national jurisdictions as well as contemporary international issues on competition law and policy (5,000-10,000 Words including footnotes)
- ii. Short Notes, which cover topical recent developments in competition law (2,000- 5,000 Words including footnotes)
- iii. Case Comments on recent or landmark cases, suggesting a change in policy or interpretation, related to competition law (1,500- 2,000 Words including footnotes)

Submission Guidelines

1. ICLR seeks submissions under the following categories:
 - a) Articles – 5,000 to 10,000 Words including footnotes.
 - b) Short Notes – 2,000 to 4,000 Words including footnotes.
 - c) Case Comments - 1,500 to 2,000 Words including footnotes.

The word count is exclusive of the footnotes.

2. ICLR accepts manuscripts on a rolling basis.
3. The last date for submissions is September 16, 2016. Submissions are to be emailed to cclpnlujodhpur@gmail.com under the subject heading 'Volume II - ICLR Submission'.
4. Submissions are required to be in Garamond font and double- spaced with font size as 12 and footnote size as 10.
5. Only use of footnotes in the submission.
6. Manuscripts received during June 15 – September 16 shall be considered for publication in the February, 2017 Issue and manuscripts received after September 16, 2016 may be considered for February, 2018 Issue.
7. Manuscripts must be related to the aspects of Competition Law & Policy
8. The manuscript must be preceded by an abstract of not more than 200 words.
9. The manuscript must be in conformity with the Bluebook: A Uniform System of Citation (19th Edition).
10. The manuscript must not contain any mention of or reference to the author's name, affiliation or credentials. Such information must be restricted to a separate cover page which must contain a brief biographical description of the author and co-author (if, any) and include the author's/ co-author's name, affiliation, qualifications and contact details.
11. The manuscript must be submitted in a Microsoft Word (.doc/.docx) format only.
12. The manuscript must be e-mailed to the Editor-in-Chief at the address mentioned above.
13. The manuscript must be an original and unpublished work. The author must also confirm

that the manuscript is not being considered for publication elsewhere.

14. If necessary, ICLR may request the author to provide a printed copy of the manuscript, in addition to the electronic copy.
15. The manuscript may be co-authored by a maximum of two authors.

Editorial Policy

1. Authors, upon submission, must communicate their acceptance of the following conditions:
 - The work, upon publication, becomes the property of National Law University, Jodhpur;
 - Permissions for subsequent publication/reprint and/or derivative works must be obtained from ICLR.
2. ICLR follows a comprehensive blind review procedure. ICLR shall endeavor to keep the authors informed about the current status of their manuscript as it goes through each stage of review.
3. ICLR retains complete discretion over acceptance/rejection of manuscripts.
4. ICLR does not entertain requests for advance decisions based on abstracts, topic proposals or outlines. Editorial decisions shall be based solely on review of the final manuscripts submitted by the authors.
5. Post-review, manuscripts may be returned to the authors with suggestions related to substance and/or style. Acceptance of a manuscript may be made contingent on incorporation of such suggestions.
6. Authors of accepted articles are entitled to receive a complimentary copy of the online issue in which their article has been published.
7. ICLR reserves the right to request copies of any resources or authorities cited in the manuscript.
