Rules & Regulations

- KES Law Colleges legal fest-"ASTRAEA" will be held on 4th and 5th February 2017 in the college premises.
- The first day of the competition consist of three events, Case probe, Brain twister and Ad-lex & the second day of the competition consist of one event i.e. Moot court competition.
- Invitation to participants is only for bonafide 3yrs and 5yrs B.L.S/L.L.B students. The age limit is restricted to maximum 30 years of age for the participants.
- Only two students shall participate in each event. Maximum 3 students per college.
- Change in the team composition will not be entertained once the names are sent to the organizers.
- The participants shall register the entries latest by 15th January 2017.
- The participant/team securing highest marks will win the trophy. .
- The registration charges per participating college are Rs.750/-, payable in Mumbai through DD in favour of KES Law College.
- Formal dress for participants is compulsory.
- Decision of the judges will be final and binding.
- Participants must mandatorily carry their college identity cards.
- Participants must report 1 hour prior to the stipulated time at the venue for confirmation of registration.
- The registration form must be duly filled and sent to the college at e-mail id astraeakeslaw@gmail.com
- Participants are requested to confirm their registration on or before the commencement of the inaugural function.
- Accommodation will be provided by the college for the students coming from outstation. The charges for the same would be Rs. 1500/-. Participant College should send the charges for accommodation through DD in favour of KES Law College.
- Organizers of the event reserve the right to change any rules and regulations without prior notice.

Case Probe

Legal precedents are regarded as one of the basic sources of law. Each law practitioner should be well versed with the land mark precedents before appearing as the counsel; this in turn requires intense research and analytical reasoning. This event aims to polish these skills in the participants.

Judging Standards

The competition shall be judged on the basis of following criteria and standards

1. Research
2. Vocabulary
3. Presentation
4. Attire
5. Team co-ordination

Rules and Regulations

1. Each team shall consist of two participants.
2. There shall be two rounds- preliminary round and final round.
3. Both the rounds shall be followed by the judge's question round.
4. Two cases for presentation shall be mailed to the participating colleges along with the registration form.
5. The name of the cases shall be mailed by the organizer to the participating teams.
6. There shall be different set of cases for the preliminary and the final round. (Two cases for preliminary round and one case for final round)
7. The teams shall be asked to present on any one case which would be given on the spot to the participants. Presentation includes envisaging the following:- The facts of the case, the judgment, further legal opinion on the case etc.
8. The participants shall have the sole discretion to either present the case alone or jointly together as a team.
9. There shall be no negative marking in the event.
10. Top four teams on the basis of their scores of preliminary round shall qualify for the final round.
11. Each team shall be given five minutes for presentation which shall be followed by two minutes allotted for judge's question round.
12. During the presentation the teams shall be allowed to carry books/laptops which are to be carried by them.
13. The judges shall have complete authority of selecting and marking and the decision of the judges shall be final.
14. Extension of time limit without judge's permission will lead to deduction of marks.
15. If any member is found guilty of misconduct or arguing with the judges, then that team shall be disqualified for all other remaining events.

Brain Twister

Rules and Regulations

1. Team of Two students per College can participate in the quiz.
2. It will consist of two rounds preliminary round and final round.
3. Four top scoring teams from the preliminary round will go to the final round.
4. Each round will further consist of three sub rounds each.

**Following are the three sub rounds for the preliminary round :
First Round**

- ▶ In this round the participants have to answer legal questions on Law of Torts.
- ▶ This round is non-transferable.
- ▶ This round contains no buzzers.
- ▶ Marks will be deducted for wrong answers.

Second Round

- ▶ In this round the participants will have to answer questions on Family law
- ▶ This round is non-transferable.
- ▶ This round contains buzzers.
- ▶ Marks will be deducted for wrong answers.

Third Round

- ▶ In this round questions on Indian Penal Code will be flashed to the participants.
- ▶ This round is transferable.
- ▶ This round contains buzzers.
- ▶ Marks will be deducted for wrong answers.

**Following are the three sub rounds for the final round:-
First Round**

- ▶ This round will consist of questions based on Indian Company Law.
- ▶ This round is non-transferable.
- ▶ This round contains no buzzers.
- ▶ Marks will be deducted for wrong answers.

Second Round

- ▶ This round will consist of questions based Environmental law.
- ▶ This round is transferable.
- ▶ This round contains buzzers.
- ▶ Marks will be deducted for wrong answers.

Third Round

- ▶ This round will consist of questions based on Indian Constitution of India.
- ▶ This round is transferable.
- ▶ This round contains buzzers.
- ▶ Marks will be deducted for wrong answers.

Further details and disclosures will be made at the venue before the commencement of the event.

Rules and Regulations

- ▶ There will be 2 participants in each team.
- ▶ The props will be given to the participants through the drawing of chits.
- ▶ The participants will be given 15 minutes prior to starting of the event to discuss the theme of their advertisement.
- ▶ Each team will be given 5 minutes to perform.
- ▶ Compulsory language – English (Phrases or connotations can be in Hindi)
- ▶ Use of abusive language is strictly prohibited and will lead to disqualification.
- ▶ Cell phones are strictly prohibited.

Ad-Lex

Ad lex is an event that aims at providing a platform to the students to showcase their convincing capabilities with legal outlooks as it aims to improve the communication skills.

Judging Standards

The competition shall be judged on the basis of following criteria and standards

1. Use of prop
2. Vocabulary
3. Message
4. Team co-ordination
5. Presentation

Moot Court Competition

Admission into a professional course is not an achievement but an opportunity to sharpen one's professional skills and one must not let it pass by.

Mooting is the oral presentation of a legal issue or problem against an opposing counsel and before a judge. It is perhaps the closest experience that a student can have whilst at university to appearing in court. Mooting will also help you to build confidence in public speaking, general research, and presentation skills, which are useful skills you can transfer to most careers.

Judging Standards

The competition shall be judged on the basis of following criteria and standards :

1. Research & knowledge of facts and laws
2. Clarity of speech, aptness in answering
3. Rationality & flow of argument
4. Court etiquette , grace demeanor & posture
5. Time keeping and punctuality

Rules and Regulations

1. The competition shall take place on 5th February, 2017.
2. The participants shall report half an hour prior to the competition.
3. Black and white formal attire is compulsory.
4. Each team will consist of three participants i.e. two mooters and one researcher.
5. Each team will be given 15 minutes in the preliminary round and 20 minutes in the final round to present their contention.
6. Two minutes will be provided to each team for rebuttal and surrebuttal would be on the discretion of the Judges.
7. Marks will be deducted for extension of time without the permission of the judge.
8. Each team has to prepare from both sides i.e. prosecution and respondent.
9. Memorials need to be submitted in soft copy and hard copy on or before **25th January, 2017**. Once the Memorials are submitted they shall be deemed as final.

Rules of Memorials :

1. Memorials should not consist of more than 30 pages. If it exceeds the given limit marks would be deducted for the same.
2. Typed on A4 Size Paper in Times New Roman, font size 12, line spacing 1.5 and margin 1 inch on all sides.
3. The memorial should be spiral bound only.
4. The memorial must contain the following parts :
 - a. Cover page
 - b. Table of contents
 - c. List of abbreviations
 - d. Index of authorities
 - e. Statement of Jurisdiction
 - f. Summary of facts
 - g. Issues involved
 - h. Summary of arguments
 - i. Body of Argument/ Arguments Advanced
 - j. Prayers
5. The Memorial Cover page should follow the following color scheme – Blue for the petitioner and Red for the Respondent.
6. The Memorial shall not contain decorative pages, sketches, annexure, affidavits, etc., as it will attract negative marking.
7. The Memorial shall not disclose the identity of college and/or of the participants. The participating colleges shall be allotted the college code at the time of registration and the same is to be mentioned on the Memorials, breach of which shall render the team liable to disqualification.
8. The teams shall be required to **exchange the Memorials** prior to preliminary round with their respective opponent teams on **4th February during lunch break**.
