## **NATIONAL SEMINAR 2019**

“All men are created equal” was penned by Thomas Jefferson in 1776 and is a part of the US Declaration of Independence. Bringing changes has been difficult, but these movements have brought a shift in the field of women empowerment which was witnessed by the reforms that it brought in the laws in our country. There is a demand of laws that bring women, men and the LGBT community in par with each other. We should endeavour to bring such changes in law so that there is practically no difference which can be spotted between the genders and bring the ethos of Article 14 in its most basic sense. There should be proper and definite equality before the law and equal protection of law to all the people whether they are men, women or whether they belong to the LGBT community.

It is high time that we fight for such equality in our society and hence, with this as our objective, we at Army Institute of Law are organizing a National Seminar on the title
