An abstract of 300–400 words accompanied by details of the author containing their email ID, contact number, name of Institution and postal address should be sent.

The Final Paper should be between 1200-1500 words. Mentioning of the sub-theme is mandatory. Co-authorship is restricted to two members.

It must be typed in Times New Roman, Font Size 12 on A4 size paper with 1.5” margin on all sides with 1.5 line spacing using MS Word. 19th Ed. Blue Book citation pattern must be strictly adhered to while submitting the abstracts and full paper.
